#### **SCI Racing Updates**

**Borrufa** The Borrufa competition proved to be a great success with a full team competing across Slalom, Giant Slalom and Combi events. The team consisted of four Children 1 and two Children 2 racers and all performed admirably. The standard of racing, particularly in the Children 1 age group has certainly improved over the past twelve months as is evident in the Borrufa results and in the future we are likely to see some spirited competion among these peers. Congratulations to the team which consisted of Hubert Gallagher, Lauren O'Riordain (both CH2), Sean Murray, Stephen Power, Maebh Byrne and Emer Pisarnik (all CH1).

**Topolino** For only the second year ever we had SCI members on an Irish team to compete at the Topolino competition in Italy. This is considered the Children's World Championship and past competitors include names such as Benie Raich and Stefan Eberharter of Austria. Our guys, Hubert Gallagher and Lauren O'Riordan, competed in both Slalom and Giant Slalom. The competition was very tough and the introduction of new rules saw only the top 60 qualify for a second run in each discipline. Hubert did very well to qualify for the second run in Slalom but unfortunately pushed a little too hard on the second run and crashed out. Despite this both Lauren and Hubert skied very well and can be proud of their achievements

**European Youth Olympics** Congratulations to the EYOF team after some very tough racing in Poland. Conditions were more suited to twin tips than slalom skis as several foot of snow descended on Slask-Biskidy which, combined with poor visibility, made for extremely tough race conditions. Simon Lyons pulled off another great result, despite a fall on the first run, and came home in 42nd position. Cillian Worrall performed well with a solid first run in slalom and was unfortunate to catch a tip close to the finish on his second run. Lisa McShera also performed well in the slalom and GS. Matt Mitchell is fast following Brian Byrne's footsteps with his no-holds barred attacking style and was unfortunate not to finish (particularly in Giant Slalom where his ski popped off due to the deep ruts). With 47 competing

**World Championships** The World Championships saw two SCI members (and coaches) Shane O'Connor and Brian Byrne compete. Brian ran in both Giant Slalom and Slalom and was unlucky not to finish in either. For those who know Brian they will be familiar with his all-put attacking style which saw him run some very good split times before pushing a little too hard and ultimately crashing out on the steeper section of both courses. Shane only competed in the Slalom event and managed to secure his best ever result with 96 FIS points (more detail on FIS at <a href="www.gis-ski.com">www.gis-ski.com</a>).

**Junior World Championships** As we write SCI race trainee Shane McShera is flying to Munich on his way to compete at the Junior World Championships in Slalom and Giant Slalom. Shane earned his place after 4 months on the FIS scholarship program which allowed him train and race fulltime this season. We wish Shane the best of luck with his races.

**English Children's Championships** Two SCI children trainees, Stephen Power and Emer Pisarnik, competed at the English children's championships where they performed well in tough conditions. Arguably an easier competition than Borrufa the standard is still very high as the UK have many excellent Children skiers. In addition the race was run on the bottom of the famous Stelvio piste in Bormio, renowned as on of the more challenging world cup downhill's. Best results saw Emer take 35th overall (10th in category) for the Slalom while Stephen took 70th overall (28th in category) also in slalom.

**Worth a mention** We've some excellent results recently across FIS races in Europe. Shane McShera scoring consist points around 140 show the obvious improvements he has made during the season while Shane O'Connor (recently referred to as being like a fine wine) became the first Irish "part time" racer to make it under 80 FIS points with a 79 at a recent race in Le Markstein in France. This quite an achievement and further raises the bar for those current and future FIS racers.

### **Some Important Dates**

Season Ticket renewals are due from 1st April. Regular practice and lessons finish on 29th March, the slopes will then be open for practice to 09/10 Season Ticket Holders on Wednesday evenings and Sunday mornings until the end of May.
