CLUB News

Our Development Although we got permission from our landlord last July to commence work on the nursery slopes, and our contractor arrived on site, the appointment of the Receiver to the Hotel complex introduced additional delays. As the Receiver became our new landlord (our seventh at Kilternan), we had to engage in lengthy discussions with his staff, providing detailed specifications on the development, information on our planning permission, broadening our insurance cover, providing various undertakings, etc. These discussions have now concluded satisfactorily. We are now coming to the end of our legal arrangements with the Sports Council in respect to our grant, and anticipate that these will conclude shortly. Then, weather conditions and Ski Club practicalities permitting, it will be "all systems go". In anticipation of the development, which requires the contractor getting access to the nursery slopes via the bottom of the intermediate slope, a counter slope has been put in place in the middle of the nursery slope to permit the upper portion of the intermediate slope to continue to be used. After the nursery slopes have been upgraded with the Snowflex matting and Travellator lifts, we plan to upgrade the Clubhouse - though this requires planning permission. This will take place at the end of the season. Although the weather is gloomy and grey at present, and there's water everywhere, it is important to remember that a major feature of our development plan is the upgrading of the entire approach to the ski slopes, to include a new entrance and extensive landscaping . All-in-all a much brighter future. When Winter comes – while to skiers' delight – can Spring be far behind. Niall

Blog Extract - Tuesday 17th Nov – Finland, mist, mist and more mist

Almost 30 hours travelling saw us arrive in Ruka (close to the the border with Russia) at 1pm Finnish time Sunday 15th. It was a unique experience jumping from the plane onto an overnight train – unique and surprisingly easy. Someone made the joke it's like the film "Planes, Trains and Automobiles" – two flights to get to Helsinki followed by the overnight train and then a hire car from Rovaniemi to Ruka. We arrived in Rovaniemi to fresh snow which made the drive to Ruka interesting – it's little wonder that the Fins are known for having such skill behind the wheel as even little old grannies were sweeping past me on the snow covered roads. When we arrived in Ruka we had a six hour wait for our apartment which gave us plenty of time to organise the slalom gates, a training lane and lift passes. It turns out there are a lot of teams here across Alpine, Ski Jumping and Freestyle so I guess there must be competitions in each discipline over the weekend.

We train slalom 7am to 9:30am which (although early) is ideal as we have the slope completely to ourselves. The only downside is the mist which seems to roll in each morning – it gives you about 3 gates visibility which is an annoyance but I guess tough conditions are good at this point. The two races in Rovaniemi are cancelled because, believe it or not, it's too warm for snow. It's hard to believe it could be too warm in mid November to make snow in Lapland. It changes our plans slightly but no matter, we'll train slalom all week, do the two races here in Ruka and then stay in Ruka to train GS all next week. In some ways it might work out for the best to get a full week training GS.

The first two days have been long and tough – we trained slalom both mornings and then after a couple of hours rest we free skied for a while before heading to the gym for some power and plyos. My big failing is not getting to bed early enough and this morning it really hurt getting up. My skiing is ok - I don't feel like I'm going especially well and at times have felt a bit stiff and conservative. But Nicky reckons I'm going ok which is a small comfort (it's too misty for any decent video). I've been impressed with how Nicky is skiing himself – he's definitely going better than I remember last season. All conjecture at this point and the first big test is next weekend with the most important outcome being to go fast.
